

ANNOUNCEMENT

DIVISION MEET

The Philadelphia Division of the National Model Railroad Association is pleased to announce that we will be having a Division Meet on Saturday, November 6, 1993, at the Fairview Village Church of the Nazerene, 3044 Germantown Pike, 1/4 mile north of the intersection of Route 363 and Germantown Pike, in Fairview Village, PA. The Meet will start at approximately 9:30 AM and will conclude at 1:00 PM for Layout Tours. Three or four area model railroaders have agreed to allow us to tour their railroads concluding the Meet. A map will be distributed following the Meet. All Division Members are encouraged to attend and bring a friend. Entrance to the Meet will be free to all Division members with a current dues card. All others will be charged a nominal \$3.00 entrance fee which includes a one year membership in the Division. The Meet will begin with a clinic presentation by Division AP Chairman, Dave Messer, MMR on one or two of the specific Achievement areas of the NMRA Achievement Program. This follows Dave's presentation at past Meets and will be continued at future Meets. Following Dave's presentation, Steve Salotti, our Assistant Superintendent, will present a Clinic on Track Planning. Incidentally, Steve is a member of the Layout Design Special Interest Group (SIG), of the NMRA. so his clinic is expected to be very beneficial for all. This will be followed by Eileen Lambert's clinic presentation on How To Give A Clinic. We will also have available for viewing, the Stewart Hobbies video on the Lehigh and New England Railroad. There will, of course, be door prizes given out through-out the meet. The ever popular, popular vote contest will be conducted and the category this time will be Passenger Equipment. The winner will, as always, receive a door prize, so

grab one of those passenger cars off your model railroad and bring it to the next Meet. In addition, flea market tables will be available to interested members for a nominal \$5.00 fee. If you would like to reserve a table, please contact John Nawn @461-8644 prior to October 31st. As stated earlier, following the meet, area model railroaders will have their railroads open until 5:00 PM. We will be distributing a map of the open Model railroads after the Meet. While your in the area, you may also want to visit some of the many fine hobby shops in the area including Penn Valley, Hennings and The Train Room in nearby Lansdale and J & D Whistle Stop in Quakertown. So mark your calendar and be sure to join us for the Division Meet on Saturday, November 6, 1993.

A WORD ON CONTESTS

We try to offer contests at Division Meets to give the members a chance to show off their modeling skills and also a chance to win some recognition for their work. However, it is disheartening to see so few members take part in the contests.

We try to keep the contests as simple as possible and the categories as broad as possible to encourage participation. No limits are placed on scale, ability, etc. For instance, our upcoming contest, Passenger Equipment, could be any scale from Z to No. 1 Gauge, could be a built up kit or completely scratchbuilt, and could be any type of equipment as long as it ran in a passenger train. So why not participate? The judging couldn't be easier. No one is going to critique your work, it's simply a popular vote of those who attend the Meet. What could be easier.

You say you don't have any passenger equipment. We get this excuse alot. So why not use the contest as an incentive to finish that particular modeling project, a goal to shoot for. I realize that this is a Hobby, and we can't get too tied up in deadlines, we have enough of them at work. But, one day we have to make an effort to finish some of those 100 some odd projects that we have started and yet to finish. And if you don't have any unfinished projects, why not the contest as an opportunity to start something new rather than just "armchairing".

It is our desire one day to also offer judged contests at the meets in addition to the popular vote contest, but we have to know that enough Division Members are interested in participating. So grab that passenger car off your layout or finish that baggage car you've been working on for the last two years, and bring it to the next Meet. It could be very rewarding (\$\$) for you.

SEPTEMBER DIVISION MEET REPORT

On Saturday, September 18, 1993, the Philadelphia Division conducted our biggest meet to date. Almost 50 division members met at the West Chester, Church of the Nazerene for what was quite possibly, our most ambitious and comprehensive Meet program. Those participating had over 13 tables of model railroad equipment available for purchase and 6 door prizes where given out including 2 gift certificates donated from Brandywine Hobbies.

A total of five individual clinics were offered. First up was Dave Messer's continuing presentation on the NMRA Achievement Program. This was followed by two clinics given by Chris Yocum on Building Locomotive Display Cases and Diesel Locomotive Weathering. This was followed by our own Chief Clerk, Mike Hazzard's slide clinic on the History and Geography of Philadelphia area railroads, which traced the development of the Philadelphia Area Railroads, paying particular attention to the way the various railroads crossed the Schylkill River to access the city. The meet concluded with a slide presentation on the New Hope & Ivyland Railroad by Bill Lambert.


Steve Salotti was the winner in the popular vote structure contest. Also available for viewing at the meet was the Division's video tape on the New Hope and Ivyland Fantrip.

Following the meet, those in attendance were treated to five layouts available for viewing. These included some of the best home layouts in the Philadelphia Division, including Paul Backenstoe's PRR Pittsburg Division layout, Jack & John Chester's club sized, Pittsburg, Cleveland & Buffalo, Bob Davis's PRR Blue Mountain Division, Jim Pond's, Jersey Pacific Railroad, and Bill Katchel's Pennsylvania & New Haven Railroad. John Van Scoyk's outdoor railroad was also scheduled to be open, but had to be cancelled due to the weather.

All in all, it was an excellent meet. Many thanks to those who participated, especially those who gave clinics and the members who allowed us the opportunity to see their home layouts.



QUICK, INEXPENSIVE DISPLAY SHELVES



Backing can be any ½" to ½" thick material - plywood and masonite are naturals.

The length of the shelves is the width of the backing piece minus the thickness of the two uprights.

Prime and finish paint all materials prior to assembly. It is much easier to have the shelves and the backing different colors if you prepaint.


Be sure your backing piece is square. As long as it is, all the shelves and uprights can be mass cut to standard measurements.


The key to easy shelves is lattice - available at lumber yards and building supply centers in a variety of widths. Choose your width depending on the scale of the models to be displayed.

Plan the distance between shelves based on the size of the models to be displayed. Leave enough room to get your fingers in there, but too much space between shelves is wasteful.

Attach uprights and shelves to backing with glue and short brads. I have built some units with almost no brads - the glue will give sufficient strength.

Attach completed unit to the wall by driving screws right through the backing.






