The Philadelphia Division is pleased to announce that we will be conducting a joint meet with the New Jersey Division on Saturday, January 18<sup>th</sup> at the Haddon Township High School in Westmont New Jersey. The meet will also include layout tours on Friday evening, January 17<sup>th</sup>. The school is located on Cuthbert Boulevard. See the map and directions elsewhere in this issue of the Dispatcher.

The Friday night layout tours are open from 7:00 until 10:00 P. M., and a map is included elsewhere in this issue. Please drive carefully, and if the weather looks doubtful, don't take any chances.

On Saturday morning, the meet will get started at 9:00 A.M. Please be sure to register when you arrive. The Philadelphia Division will have a table to register at and pick up your door prize ticket.

There will be two clinics for this meet, Bob Hubbard's "Model Railroad Chemistry 101" and George Duve's "Stress, Strains, and Trains". Bob's presentation is a result of legitimate questions posed to him by members regarding adhesives: i.e. what fastens X to Y best and why not

George Duve, like Bob is an engineer. The rest of us have only a general idea why the railroads did what they did and how they did it. George will acquaint us with the physical laws that govern getting a railroad from here to there and how that applies to their equipment as well.

Starting at 1:00 P.M., there will be more local layouts for you to visit. A map will be available at the meet. These owners are inviting you into their homes, so be sure to be courteous. The layouts will be open until 4:00 P.M., unless otherwise noted on the maps.





In about 2 miles, at the forth traffic light, is Park Avenue. Turn left onto Park Avenue. Continue on Park until you come to the school. The meet is in the Cafeteria. Travel time from the Ben Franklin Bridge is about 15 minutes.





#### Schedules
