Our first clinic will be presented by Val Pistilli on handlaying track. Val will discuss the various techniques used on the clubs extensive layout.

The second clinic will be a presentation by Chris O'Brien entitled "Operations on the GATSME layout". This large club layout is host to regularly scheduled operation, and Chris will give us insight into how it is carried out.

We will break for lunch at around noon. There are a number of local places for you to grab a quick bite to eat, and then return to the club.

From the Fort Washington exit of the Pennsylvania Turnpike turn right onto Pennsylvania Avenue. Follow Pennsylvania Avenue to iunction with Summit Avenue. Turn right onto Summit Avenue and follow it to the intersection with Prospect Avenue. Turn right onto Prospect Avenue and follow it to the stop sign. The club will be in the large building on the right corner.
