He will be sharing some of the techniques he uses to help you improve your skills. If you have a resin kit you have built, bring it along, both for the contest, and to be a part of this fun activity. You will be given 5 – 10 minutes to tell us what you did, what worked and what didn't, and any other suggestions or tricks you learned along the way. And in case you didn't know, our contest is resin Models.

After the meets conclusion, starting at 1:00 PM there will be 5 layouts open for you to tour. With this new location many of these are layouts that have never been open for a Philadelphia Division meet, and they are all top notch layouts. This will be a great day to see what others are doing.

Coffee and donuts will be available at the meet for a donation, and there are several restaurants in the area for you to get lunch before the layout tours begin at 1:00 PM.

Losing weight, getting organized, and maybe cleaning the garage, throwing away that stuff I've saved for the last 50 years? The list could go on and on, but you catch my drift. There is an easy answer to the dilemma, just don't make any more We don't usually resolutions! keep them anyway, so why bother. But let's face it; we still make them every year, at least in our minds, even if we don't write them down.

Happily for the Susquehanna, one of those resolutions is coming into fruition. For a long time I've had this shelf along one side of the basement that was originally designed to be the Edgewater branch. But it was just such a great place to store stuff, and for operating sessions it was perfect for laying out those necessary things like switch lists, train order forms and train sign up sheets. Also lurking on one of those overfilled storage shelves was a resin tug boat kit. The thought came to me over the holidays that if I started the tug boat maybe Edgewater would follow.

Sure enough, as soon as I started the boat the ideas began to flow. I mean if you're going to have a boat it will need some water to sit in (OK, gloss medium, not real water), and if you have a boat you'll need some barges for it to push. And if you have a barge you'll need a place to load it, right? And of course you'll need some tracks to haul the freight in and out of the port.

As this is being written, the layout for the large Ford plant in Edgewater is well under way, including building some of the smaller buildings to clutter up the

area, some tanks to hold the oils used in the manufacturing process, and the wharf the whole affair will sit on. The ties are in for the track, and even some of the rail is laid. Maybe by the next operating session the Ford job will be able to actually spot some cars in the plant.

There is even a little progress on some of the other areas in Edgewater. On the Susquehanna, this short branch served the furthest north of the Hudson River terminals. This area was heavily industrialized with many major American companies represented. I have a map which the basic shows all track arrangements in the area, and the complexity of it would challenge the most enthusiastic track layer.

But here's the rub. Did you to locate usable try photographs of specific industrial buildings? In conversation with every Susquehanna fan I know the answer has been the same so far: we all have roster shots, and many taken on the tracks in question, but not one shot of any industries. Oh sure, you can see a building in the distant background. Or there's a corner of one here and there, but usable? Not hardly. And you all know that when you build something, as soon as it's finished a new photo will surface that shows clearly what you did wrong. Sure, a few of the smaller buildings still stand, but almost the entire area been turned has into condominiums, not very appealing for an industrial harbor. And so the saga continues.

Now if I could only find the time to finish that darn tug boat!

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
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Map to the Church of the Incarnation



From Interstate 95 exit at exit 46 for Langhorne, PA. Follow signs for US Route 1 North. Travel on US 1 North for approximately _ mile Watch for exit for Oxford Valley. At the Oxford Valley exit turn Left onto Oxford Valley Road. Follow Oxford Valley Road for approximately _ mile, then turn Right onto Big Oak Road. Follow Big Oak Road for 2 _ miles, and watch for Makefield Avenue. Turn Left onto Makefield Avenue, and watch for the Church of the Incarnation.
