We will have two clinics for this meet. Dennis Tiley will give a presentation entitled "The Reading as I saw it", and will cover most of the system during the period from 1965 to 1975. Dennis worked several years in engineering department during the 1960s. Going back to his grandfather and several uncles, the Tiley family had approximately 102 years of continuous service to the Reading Company. (Yes, there was more than one railroad in the Philadelphia area, though some don't want to admit it.)

Our second clinic will be a presentation by Gerard Fitzgerald on his freelanced C&O branch line layout. Gerard gave this clinic at the Pittsburgh RPM meet this past March and it was very well received.

Our contest for this meet will be model railroad photographs. At our last meet we had a clinic on photography, now you have the opportunity to try out the things you learned! Grab the camera and get snapping. Both digitally enhanced and standard film shots are eligible.

# Form 19

Unbeknownst to most model railroaders in this area, on the weekend of April 26th to the 29th the loosely organized group known as Pro Rail came to town. This function, which means "Prototype Railroaders" hosts an annual event that moves to different areas each year. (It will be about 10 years before it returns to this area). The sole function of the group is to get together with like minded others and operate on prototype based model railroads. I had the privilege of being asked to host two operating sessions on my New York, Susquehanna & Western based layout.

On the appointed days, 8 guests plus a few of my regular operators descended on my basement. To say I was a little intimidated would be putting it mildly. How would my railroad hold up? Would it be a disaster, or would the sessions go smoothly? One of my regulars quipped to me quietly "are any of these guys not authors?"

Among the attendees for the Saturday session was one gentleman in particular that I had based almost all of the operating procedures I use on articles he had written for the model railroad He had requested my railroad, and wanted to be the dispatcher! He had spent his career working on the railroad, and had held that position for many years. In addition, he offers training sessions for those who want learn how the prototype did it (maybe I should have taken the class).

After a brief introduction and safety meeting where we go over a few of the rules and other general information about the throttles and the railroad, we handed out assignments and started to run. Under normal circumstances, having an almost

entirely new crew can cause things to bog down in a hurry. Simple things like "which way is west?" or "where is East Paterson?" need to be answered. And one of the most frequently asked; "where is bathroom?" (Top of the stairs on And on my railroad. the left). which uses a simplified version of Timetable & Train Order to control traffic, it doesn't take long for folks to be thoroughly befuddled.

If you've been in this hobby for long, you probably know that a few of us take this thing a little too seriously, and I'd have to admit I'm one of the worst. (Remember, we're only playing with toy trains). But to my surprise and joy, these guys knew how to play the game. For the most part they had a good basic knowledge of TT&TO wanted to follow the rules. The dispatcher worked calmly getting things started; the crews knew what they were supposed to do, and for the next 8 hours (with a break for lunch) we played trains. As the day wore on I started saying "we can quit anytime you're ready" (they had to go back to Allentown at the end of the day), but they wouldn't stop until there were no trains left to run. This was the first time ever we ran every train on the schedule for a whole day (I normally run first a morning schedule then the next month an evening schedule). As the guests started leaving well after 6:00 PM, they all expressed appreciation for a great day, including the dispatcher! dispatcher did offer a couple of suggestions which I hope to incorporate, but said he had great fun. Do we really have to wait 10 years to have these guys back again?

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

# **Division Tour to Steamtown National Historic Site**

What: The Philadelphia Division is sponsoring an all day bus trip to Steamtown which occupies about 40 acres of the old Scranton yard of the Delaware, Lackawanna & Western Railroad. The heart of this renovated site, which is managed by the National Park Service, is the operating steam locomotives, their roundhouse and the expansive full-service back shop. In addition there is a daily excursion, a theater, history museum, technology museum, an HO scale layout as well as a large collection of static, standard-gauge steam locomotives, freight cars, passenger cars and maintenance-of-way equipment from several historic railroads. Why: Support the Division, come out and meet some of the 460+ members and share your railroading experiences with old friends and new acquaintances. In addition, this museum provides a wealth of prototype information. All of the static equipment in the yard can be inspected, measured and photographed (no climbing). As a bonus, we will be raffling off a cab ride in the locomotive of the local excursion.

**How:** Leave you car in the parking lot of the Fairview Village Church of the Nazarene located at 3060 Germantown Pike, Fairview Village, PA. The air-conditioned motor coaches, with rest room facilities, will depart at 7:00AM and return at approximately 5:00PM.



**When:** Saturday, September 15, 2007 – 7:00AM sharp.

Cost: \$40.00 per person (no discounts for children or seniors) includes transportation and admission to the museum. Guests are welcomed but one person in each party must be a current NMRA member. A full refund for written cancellations received 30 days prior to departure. Limited seating on a first come basis. Lunch can be purchased in the food court of the adjacent shopping mall.

StARR, St Alban's Railroad Fellowship next operating session is on June 9th, 2007. We start at 7:30 PM. NMRA members that are interested at running on a HO DCC operating layout are welcome. The HO layout fills the basement room that is 50' by 80'. You can bring your own DCC locomotive and caboose. The layout is a Digitrax DCC system. If you have your own throttle please bring it. The radios we use are the FRS radios using channel 8.1.

The Saturday night session is an operating session using a card system. We use an error friendly card system. If you make a mistake you won't mess up the card system and we don't have to stop to look for the rolling stock. It will be picked up or delivered in the next operating session.

We have a schedule of trains and you sign up for a train. We will have Starr members available to guide you. You must communicate with the dispatcher in order to get clearance for train departures. The dispatcher also controls the mainline turnouts from a computer. The two different yards and the local industry turnouts are manually controlled.


Please contact me to make a reservation. We have a limited number of guest positions. I will confirm that the guest positions are available. There is no cost to run at an operating session.



If coming South on Route 252 turn left at the first light after Goshen Road onto Winding Way (look for Commerce Bank on the corner). Bear to the right at the stop sign and continue up the hill to the traffic circle. Go 1/4 way around the traffic circle and right onto Chapel Road to just before the end, where you turn right into the church parking lot. From all other directions turn onto route 252 north and turn right onto Chapel Road then left into the parking lot.
