There are quite a few exciting things going on in the Philadelphia Division at the moment. What could be more exciting than the upcoming RPM Valley Forge meet? We expect this year to be better than it was in '08 with a great lineup of clinics, layouts and vendors. Each year it has grown a little bigger than before and if it keeps getting bigger we may need to look for a new location! Not a bad problem to have. I hope you are planning to go.

We also have our newest car project, the Sunoco Oil Company Tank car. For each RPM meet the division board looks for a car that is related to the industries or railroads that were located in this area, and Sunoco is one of the largest. Similar cars have been done before, but this car has the earliest herald style and is being done in 8 different numbers so you can have a large fleet! These cars are also another first for the division: ready to run cars! All past products have been in the form of kits, but the board decided to test the waters what seems to be a growing trend within the hobby. Yes, they are a little more expensive than past offerings, but based on the artwork used they will be a great addition to your roster.

The meet location for this year has not been selected as of this writing, but we expect it to be in the central Montgomery County area. Watch for the next issue of the Dispatcher to provide the information. As usual there will be clinics and a contest. In addition, this will be the meet where elections for the next board

will be conducted. We are pleased to have several new hats being thrown into the ring. The next issue will provide you with a list of candidates and an official ballot.

Now that the business of the day has been taken care of, it's time to move on to something a little more fun. There has been some progress on the railroad during the last few months, but as always, not as much as I would like. And the old habit of starting too many projects to complete is so hard to shake.

The main area of work has been in downtown Paterson. The Susquehanna had a branch that came off the main line at Broadway Street and headed almost due west about $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile towards Straight Street near the Erie's station. The line ran behind many dwellings and small businesses. There was very little industry on the line, but the passenger traffic was quite heavy during my modeling period. I've started working on a number of store and housing units that will go up against the backdrop. The hardest part is finding good photos of store interiors to fill all those windows. The one's I've found are either too old or don't reproduce well. But I keep plugging away at it, and maybe sometime soon the line will start to look like it's going through the proverbial "urban canyon". There is certainly no shortage of kits available to kit bash, and then add a few details to make them unique.

Well, that's all for this issue. I hope I'll see you at RPM Valley Forge. If you haven't done it, get your registration in soon.

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
