Greetings, NMRA members! This special election edition of our newsletter, *The Dispatcher*, has been mailed to all Philadelphia Division members. The issue is also available in color on our website at www.phillynmra.org. Any NMRA member residing in the Pennsylvania counties of Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Montgomery, or Philadelphia, or anywhere in the state of Delaware, is automatically a member of the Philadelphia Division.

Each spring we hold elections for open positions on our board of directors. The division bylaws direct us to elect a total of seven board members for two-year terms, four positions of which on odd years, and the other three on even years—so this year there are three positions open. The board members then elect four officers from among themselves, while the remaining three serve as directors at large.

As of this time, nominations are closed. Below and on the following pages are the statements of each of the can

didates running for office. This year we are conducting the voting both online with the “Election Buddy” app and through mail-in paper ballots. Each member who has provided a working email address will receive an online ballot. You may choose to vote either online or by paper ballot. If you vote online, any paper ballot received will be discarded.

The paper ballot can be found on page 3. If you choose to use it to cast your vote, kindly indicate your choices as directed and follow the mailing instructions. The election results will be announced at the June meet and will be posted on the website and published in the August issue of *The Dispatcher*. Growing up in Philadelphia, I, like so many children, had an American Flyer train set running around my Christmas tree. Living three blocks from the Northeast corridor at Holmesburg Tower, I saw my fair share of real passenger and freight trains. As a matter of fact, I dodged many while trespassing on their tracks. From an early age I was intrigued by the workings of both the small and the much larger. It was no surprise when I chose working on a railroad as my career.

I served four years in the Marine Corps after high school graduation. While attending school on the GI Bill, I secured a job with the Reading Railroad as a coach cleaner. I rose through the ranks as Reading became Conrail. After ten years of service I made a change. I joined Amtrak in the back shops. During my tenure with Amtrak, I supervised locomotive and passenger car overhauls. I eventually became Assistant Superintendent of the Mechanical Department. I retired in 2004.

By 1992, my layout was part of the round robin rotation with these gentlemen. I owe a great deal of gratitude to them.

In 2016, while hosting an open house of my layout, I met Philadelphia Division member of the NMRA, William Fagan. He asked if he could videotape the railroad, and submit the video of the layout for a Golden Spike award. Not being an NMRA member at the time, I had no idea what that was.

I have been a model railroader since about three years old when each Christmas would involve a setup of a Unique Art tinplate set. This evolved to a basement layout with an “L” shaped 4x6 and 4x8 and a Marx steam engine, Lionel operating cars, and an extensive Plasticville building collection. About 1961, I converted to HO with Athearn HF rubber band drive diesels. About the same time, I met fellow modeler Bruce Elfreth (in Florida since 1965) in Junior High School, and he got me interested in traction modeling. I also got involved with restoring, operating, and maintaining full size trolleys with Trolley Valhalla in Tansboro and Jobstown, NJ, Buckingham Valley Trolley Association in Bucks County PA, the Penns Landing Trolley along the Philadelphia waterfront, and the Electric City Trolley Museum Association in Scranton, PA.

I started an extensive HO trolley layout featuring down

town Philadelphia and the surface car subway 1n 1966 and after three moves it still forms the core of my present layout. With Bruce, I visited the lobby exhibit area in the Ben Franklin Hotel when the NMRA had its annual convention in Philadelphia in 1964. I formally joined the NMRA in 1990 when I attended the national convention in Pittsburgh of that year attending the NMRA tours and assisting the East Penn Traction Club with their display. I similarly assisted and coordinated East Penn when they exhibited at the 2006 Philadelphia NMRA Convention and train show. I currently serve as Treasurer for both the Electric City Trolley Museum Association and the Abington Lines Model Railroad Club. I also am the Secretary/Treasurer and interim Newsletter editor for the East Penn Traction Club.

I hope I can help the Division with guidance and direction as a director as they continue to evolve and move forward. Thank you for your support.
