Greetings, NMRA members! This special election edition of our newsletter, *The Dispatcher*, has been mailed to all Philadelphia Division members. The issue is also available in color on our website at <u>www.phillynmra.org.</u> Any NMRA member residing in the Pennsylvania counties of Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Montgomery, or Philadelphia, or anywhere in the state of Delaware, is automatically a member of the Philadelphia Division.

Each spring the division holds elections for open positions on our board of directors. The division bylaws direct us to elect a total of seven board members for two-year terms, four positions of which on odd years, and the other three on even years—so this year there are four positions open. The board members then elect four officers from among themselves, while the remaining three serve as directors at large.

As of this time, nominations are closed. Below and on

the following pages are the statements of each of the candidates running for office. Each division member who has provided a working email address will receive a link to an online ballot through the Election Buddy program. You may choose to vote either electronically or by mailing in a paper ballot (located on page 3). If you vote electronically, any paper ballot received will be discarded.

The election results will be announced at the June meet and will be posted on the website and published in the August issue of *The Dispatcher*. Additional copies of this issue and ballots can be downloaded and printed from the link on the right sidebar of the division website, www.phillynmra.org.

Candidates' Statements



Kevin Feeney

I am a retired CPA and college accounting professor. I have been a life member of the NMRA since the 1990s and served as a member of the NMRA board of directors and as an officer. I have been

formally involved with the Philadelphia Division since I moved to Abington, Pennsylvania in 2019.

When I lived in Connecticut, I started a new NMRA

division, Metro-North, and served in various positions including chair of two NER conventions. I was on the committees for the 1993, 2006, and 2009 NMRA conventions and the 2019 MER convention run by our divison. I have attended countless NMRA events in maybe 14 different regions across the US and the UK.

I hold AP certificates for Officer, Volunteer, and Author and am actively working on Chief Dispatcher.

I visited a number of tourist railroads and museums growing up that influenced my interest in trains, as well as reading numerous library books about railroads. I drifted into and out of

clinic in November 2021 on hand-laid track, and am scheduled for three clinics at the MER Altoona meet in October. I've also helped represent the division by volunteering at several train shows.
